# Christmas Bark

Ingredients:

- 8 ounces of white baking chocolate
- 3 ounces of bittersweet baking chocolate
- candy eyes
- candy m&m's
- mini pretzels

Directions:



Melt the chocolate in a microwave. Add chopped white chocolate into a heatproof bowl (metal or ceramic). Pour boiling water into a medium pot. Place the bowl on top of the pot. The bowl shouldn't touch the surface of the water. Cook over the lowest heat, stirring the chocolate from time to time until it is almost completely melted. Take the bowl off the pot and stir the chocolate with a spoon until it's completely melted. Repeat for bittersweet chocolate. Spread white chocolate on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Dollop chocolate in white chocolate to resemble a deer face. Break pretzels in half to resemble deer antlers and place above dollop of chocolate face.

Insert eyes and nose and refridgerate for 1 hour. Remove and break into smaller pieces.
